

## HOT FALL HUES

You packed away the white linen pants, now do the same with the makeup, nail and hair colors that made you feel glam all summer. Autumn 2009's color palette has an entirely new vibe. You'll fall in love with this season's shades, which are deep, strong, unique – and refreshingly wearable. So have fun and experiment to find the color combination that's right for you.

### Face

Fall's most fashionable faces favor more pigmented colors. Think shades like eggplants and grays or blends of mosses and darker blues to create a deeper eye. Then accent the eye with prominent lashes – thanks to either heavier mascara or lash extensions. Cheeks make a statement with bricks and plums or sway toward the naturals (a gold-based peachy pink is always fresh with a deep eye). Classic red reigns once again on the lips, along with beautiful burgundies and plums. ### Nails

Nail colors – following clothing trends – are a definite departure from the classic reds and sheer French looks of seasons past. ### Tresses

For blondes, the big buzz word is “champagne” – a striking mix of warm and cool shades favored by celebs like Nicole Richie and Charlize Theron. Brunettes crave rich, chocolaty or eggplant hues (think Fergie's new look) and redheads, like Lindsay Lohan, are going for cooler, more muted tones with a violet cast. And women with all hair colors are experimenting with the power of well-placed accent color, in the bangs for example. Finally, no matter which shade you choose, a cellophanes treatment will help lock-in great color and deliver an added kick of shine.
