Elmhurst police are looking for a man in his late 20s who attempted to sexually assault one child and exposed himself to several children during a wedding reception last week.

Police said the clean-shaven man is about 5 feet 10 inches tall, weighs between 160 and 180 pounds, has dark, spiked hair and was wearing a pink, traditional Indian "Kurta" shirt during the wedding reception on Sunday, Sept. 5.
