The Right Pop of Color for Every Skin Tone

Skin Tone	For Lips	For Hair
Cool Ivory Tones	Pink-based reds are the best lip choice for people with milky-white skin (See: Liv Tyler).	Seek out more deep, red-violets if this is your tone (See: Kate Walsh).
Warm Yellow Tones	Orange-reds or more coral shades of red offer the right mix for these warmer tones (See: Reese Witherspoon).	Have natural freckles? You probably have more true red tendencies (See: Marcia Cross). Tend toward lighter shades with golden flecks? Red oranges may be your fit (See: Nicole Kidman).
Olive and Darker Tones	Deeper, richer skin tones work best with more blue-based reds. Look for colors with a touch of violet (See: Teri Hatcher, Beyonce Knowles).	Red hues are difficult when this is your skin type. Consult a professional to discuss color theory and appropriate shades before diving into a sea of red.
A Little Red for Everyone	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Brown-reds are the easiest shades for all skin types and ages to work with. This provides a less intense red for a touch of color. • There's no need to use the same reds your friends use. Mario Tricoci's Cose cosmetics line is all custom-blended.
